Overview	You may be aware that the number of reported COVID-19 cases confirmed as positive is increasing in the UK.  What is COVID-19?  COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways and it caused by a virus called coronavirus. The symptoms you may experience are; a cough, a high temperature and shortness of breath. These symptoms are similar to other illnesses such as the common cold or flu and may not mean that you have contracted COVID-19.  Key Facts  NHS 111 has an online coronavirus service that can tell you if you need medical help and advise you what to do.  Do not attend your doctors surgery, hospital or walk in centre if you think you may have coronavirus. Call your doctors surgery or NHS 111.  If there's a chance you could have coronavirus you may be asked to stay away from other people (self-isolate). This means you should:  stay at home not go to work, school or public places not use public transport or taxis ask friends, family or delivery services to do errands for you try to avoid visitors to your home - it's okay for friends, family or delivery drivers to drop off								
	<ul> <li>✓ wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds. Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.</li> <li>✓ always wash your hands when you get home or into work.</li> <li>✓ cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze.</li> <li>✓ put used tissues in the bin straight away and wash your hands afterwards.</li> <li>✓ try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell.</li> </ul>
