Overview	<p>Human Rights Day is observed every year on 10 December — the day the United Nations General Assembly adopted, in 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR): a milestone document proclaiming the inalienable rights which everyone is inherently entitled to as a human being regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Hundreds of very different religious festivals are held around the world each year.</p> <p>Below are the festivals that are celebrated during December:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2nd - 9th Hanukkah - Jewish festival that celebrates victory over religious persecution. • 7th Al Hijira - Muslim festival celebrating the migration of Prophet Mohammed from Mecca to Medina. • 8th Bodhi Day - Buddhist festival celebrating Gautama's attainment of enlightenment. • 16th Ashura - Muslim festival. Suni Muslims celebrate the day that Nuh (Noah) left the arc and the day that Musa (Moses) was saved from the Egyptians by Allah. Shi'ite's mark the martyrdom of Hussein. • 21st Youle - Pagan festival that marks the winter solstice when the sun child is reborn. • 25th Christmas Day - Christian festival that celebrates the birth of Christ. • 26th St Stephen's Day - Christian festival celebrates the first Christian martyr. <p>Want to learn more? Overview	<p>Alcohol abuse is drinking more than the recommended limits of alcohol consumption. The recommended daily limits for alcohol consumption are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No more than three to four units a day for men No more than two to three units a day for women <p>There are three main types of alcohol misuse:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hazardous drinking: drinking over the recommended limits Harmful drinking: drinking over the recommended limits and experiencing alcohol-related health problems Dependent drinking: feeling unable to function without alcohol <p>Risks of alcohol misuse include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Alcohol poisoning, which may include vomiting, seizures (fits) and unconsciousness Violent behaviour that might lead to being arrested by the police Unprotected sex that could potentially lead to unplanned pregnancy or a sexual transmitted infection Loss of possessions, such as a wallet, keys or phone, leading to feelings of anxiety Health problems such as strokes, liver disease, bowel cancer <p>As well as health problems, long-term alcohol misuse can lead to social problems such as unemployment, divorce, domestic abuse and homelessness.</p> <p>To see how many units you drink in a typical week, you can use the Drink Aware - Units & Calorie Calculator: https://www.drinkaware.co.uk/understand-your-drinking/unit-calculator</p> <p>Whilst out celebrating over Christmas and New Year please consider the following advice from Northumbria Police:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Never accept drinks from a stranger Don't share or exchange drinks Never leave your drink unattended Don't just assume a friend is drunk - get them home safely. <p>For further information or to get help you can contact Alcoholics Anonymous on 0845 769 755</p>
