

Viking Energy Network Jarrow

South Tyneside's flagship renewable energy scheme, the Viking Energy Network at Jarrow, is complete and set to cut annual carbon emissions by 1,035 tonnes.

We are incredibly proud to be leading the way with this multi-million-pound pioneering project which harnesses low-grade heat from the River Tyne and exports it to councilowned buildings, including Jarrow Focus leisure centre, three residential tower blocks, Jarrow Business Centre and Jarrow Town Hall.

This network – a UK-first – is unique in that it combines three renewable technologies – a river source heat pump, a combined heat and power (CHP) back-up system and a 1-megawatt solar farm – ensuring minimal use of fossil fuels. It also has a private wire electrical network with storage battery.

A new energy centre on the banks of the river and extensive pipe network is used to distribute the heat across the town.

The innovative new network, constructed by Colloide Engineering Systems Ltd, demonstrates our commitment to net zero and a switch to cleaner, more secure energy sources.

The Department for Energy Security and Net Zero is funding a phase 2 study into the potential of expanding the heat network to connect other local buildings.

School Streets trial underway

Two Jarrow primary schools are taking part in a six-month trial of School Streets to help create a safer, healthier environment outside the school gate.

Vehicles are not permitted on the roads outside Simonside Primary School and St Mary's RC Primary School on school days (Monday to Friday) at specific times (8-9.15am and 2.30-4pm) until Monday 18 March 2024.

The roads affected include:

- Glasgow Road
- Arran Drive
- Ayr Drive
- Crieff Grove

The trial aims to reduce traffic around the schools, encourage more children to walk, wheel, scoot or cycle, and improve air quality.

Sustrans is a national charity who works with schools across the UK to help more children get active on the school run.

It will also make the street calmer for residents too. I'm really excited about the scheme, and I hope it will encourage other schools in South Tyneside to try a School Street too.

Families who need to travel can drive and 'park and stride' from parking on the Scotch Estate and at Perth Green Community Association.

Signage is in place advising residents of the restrictions to vehicles. Residents on those streets, Blue Badge holders, teachers and those with legitimate reasons will be allowed vehicular access.

How do you feel about maths?


If the thought of using numbers leaves you feeling a little uncomfortable, you're not alone.





Investing in children's care

Work to increase the number of residential places for South Tyneside's children in care is underway at two sites.

Building Children's Homes

A new children's home is being built at Grant Street in Jarrow to accommodate up to four children and works have started in Seton Avenue in South Shields on an assessment centre which will offer overnight support on a short-term basis for up to two children.

A further children's home will be built in Hebburn New Town to house up to another four children.

"We are committed to providing our cared-for children with the best home and parenting experience we can offer, so they can attend school, see their families and enjoy time with their friends."

Once complete, these developments will almost triple the number of placements for children in care in our borough. The new developments are the latest pillars of investment as we continue our improvement journey for children's services.

Responding To Need

The new builds are a direct response from the Council to a lack of places for children in care. As is the case for other councils, South Tyneside's young people are sometimes placed away from family and friends. Previously this has been as far away as Scotland and Lancashire. The new builds will allow children to stay in the communities they call home, close to their school, family and friends which will provide stability in their lives.

Each of the sites incorporate adequate parking, including designated disabled parking and on-site electric charging points.

Work should be complete within the year on the schemes with disruption kept to a minimum.

Improving how we deliver tenancy support to customers.

We've launched a new way of working to support our tenants!

Changes have been made so we can focus on supporting tenants to maintain their tenancies and properties.

Area Management, (which includes teams like street cleaning, emptying litter bins, removing graffiti and cleaning the seafront) was previously delivered by South Tyneside Homes. The teams moved to South Tyneside Council to align more closely with other council teams, including the co-ordination of work agreed at Community Area Forums (CAFs).

We have reshaped our teams and services, so they are more effective and efficient. We have brought our Income and Housing teams together, making things easier for you if you come to us for support or advice.

You will soon see more Housing Officers on the ground in your local area. These members of the team are positioned to work with and support tenants just like you. If you spot a Housing Officer out and about, say hello!

The Officers have significantly smaller patches than before, so they can easily build relationships with tenants and understand what you need from us. This means that you will have one designated point of contact for any queries or questions relating to your tenancy or your property going forward.

Your Housing Officer will be contacting you shortly to introduce themselves. You will receive a letter with their name and contact telephone number – if you have any questions about your tenancy or property you will be able to contact them directly.



Protect yourself and others against Flu

Eligible residents encouraged to get free flu jab

A South Tyneside woman is urging eligible people to take up the offer of a free flu jab after her Christmas was spoiled last year by the disease. Janine Cole, 45, of the Fellgate Estate in Jarrow, is entitled to

a free flu vaccine because she has an autoimmune disease, which makes her more susceptible to complications of influenza (flu).

Last year, Janine, who is a teaching assistant, was busy with other things and simply forgot to get the vaccine.

But just days before Christmas she was struck down with flu. On Christmas Day she managed to crawl out of bed to watch her teenage children open their presents but was so weak she could not even sit up.

Janine became progressively worse and ended up in Urgent Care where her blood oxygen levels were found to be extremely low. The flu had developed into pleurisy which caused severe chest pain.

Janine, who is usually a fit and active person, was ill for three weeks. She said: "I missed Christmas and New Year and I had to take an extra week off work to recover.

I certainly will be getting the flu jab this year and would highly recommend anyone who is eligible to do so."

People aged 65 and over, pregnant women, children aged between two and nine and those with an underlying health condition as well as carers and those living in a care home are advised to have the vaccine.

What is a Local Area Coordinator?

Local Area Coordinators are paid workers who get to know the local residents and families, including those accessing services like health and social care.

Coordinators will:

- Be based in a specific area
- Available to everyone in that area, with no referral or time limit
- Get to know residents so they can help shape and coordinate their plans for a better life
- Listen and focus on people's strengths to build relationships and trust
- Work with local groups, services and organisations

Local Coordination is designed to help people regain and maintain control of their lives, so they can stay strong and connected to members of their own communities.

Little inventors idea brought to life by South Tyneside Pledge organisations

A young inventor from South Shields is to see his planetsaving idea spring to life, with the support of two South Tyneside pioneers.

Cell Pack Solutions and Ford Aerospace were two of the many local businesses and bright minds to back the campaign, with both companies agreeing to collaborate to help bring one of the winning ideas to life.

Nine-year-old Isaac, from Cleadon, visited Ford Aerospace at Port of Tyne to present his Wind Mirrors to a panel of high-profile business leaders.

Working in partnership with schools across South Tyneside, the Little Inventors Programme launched in February as a challenge to year 4 and 5 students to create inventions powered by movement and wind that could help reverse climate change.

Isaac's idea, 'Wind Mirrors', would see propellors manufactured that could be attached underneath vehicle wing mirrors to generate renewable electricity that can be used to power vehicular accessories.

Both organisations were inspired to get involved having signed the South Tyneside Pledge, a commitment by over two hundred local organisations to boost local economic activity, reduce health inequalities, lower carbon emissions, and enhance civic pride. Equinor, Operator of Dogger Bank Wind Farm is also a signatory of the pledge.

What is Anti-Social Behaviour?

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) is behaviour by a person which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household.

This includes:

- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours
- Littering or dumping rubbish
- Shouting or noisy behaviour in places where this might be annoying or upsetting
- Using rude, abusive or insulting language
- •Threatening behaviour or bullying
- Alcohol related trouble or buying and selling of drugs







What can the Council do about ASB?

The powers we have include ASBOs, parenting orders and premises closure orders (the power to close properties after serious persistent nuisance or disorder).

The Council and Homes work together to deal with disruptive tenants in council properties and issue fines for littering, dog fouling, fly tipping and breaching PSPO orders.

Crimes such as drug dealing, assault, threatening behaviour, car theft and burglary should all be reported to the Police on **999** or **101**.

If in immediate danger call 999.


Time to put the brakes on nuisance bikers

Alongside Northumbria Police and South Tyneside Homes we are working together to reduce motorcycle nuisance across South Tyneside.



If you are affected you can REPORT motorcycle nuisance by:

- Calling 101
- Report an incident online at www.northumbria.police.uk
- Email: community.safety@southtyneside.gov.uk



Riding on open land, parks, rights of way and footpaths is almost always illegal.

Even on private land, permission is required from the owner of the land.

What do we need to know?

- Details of the motorcycle (e.g. number plate, make, model and colour and where it is stored)
- Details of the rider (e.g. name, address and what they are wearing)
- When and where the motorcycle is being used (e.g. days, times and routes) All information will be confidential.

The rider must also:

- Be 17yrs or over
- Hold a valid driving license
- Wear a helmet

Do you know the law?

The police can seize motor vehicles that are used to cause alarm, distress, or annoyance to members of the public.

Parents are liable to pay a recovery fee on any cycle seized from their child.

You can only ride an off-road motorbike legally if it is on private land and land owned by the council is not private!

Foster with North East - a collaborative partnership between South Tyneside Council and 11 other North East local authorities

For the first time, anyone considering a career in fostering in the North East will benefit from a united, single support hub for potential and newly-appointed foster carers. The Foster with North East team will be on-hand to offer advice, training and support alongside expert social workers from our South Tyneside Council fostering team.

Vivienne and her husband have been foster carers for 15 years with South Tyneside Council. They have five children and 12 grandchildren and are currently caring for two young people aged 8 and 9.

Speaking about her experiences of fostering Vivienne said,

"I would advise anybody thinking about getting into fostering to explore it further. I'm a long-term carer, having been fostering for 15 years, and in that time, I've fostered 23 children.

"Currently I'm looking after two siblings - I'm so pleased that they still have each other and I'm able to make a positive difference to their lives. Fostering really is the most rewarding thing I have ever done, and there are so many different kinds of children you can help."

South Tyneside has seven one-bedroomed properties for people sleeping on the street, or at risk of becoming homeless.

Thanks to funding from the government's Rough Sleeping Accommodation Programme, tenants can stay in the homes for up to two years.



Anthony's story

Anthony* found himself living rough after his long-term relationship broke down.

The 57-year-old said: "I slept in an abandoned garage and a shed; it was absolutely freezing and damp. I've always been a bit of a loner, so I didn't call on friends or anything. No one knew I was there

"I went to the doctor and he put me in touch with an outreach worker from South Tyneside Homes. He started off by getting me food parcels as he knew I hadn't been eating. He then put me in touch with my support worker, who managed to get me this flat."

Anthony is visited by his support worker several times a week and is helped with finances, accessing different services and attending appointments.

"I'm so grateful for this support; I dread to think where I'd be now without it."

Liam Salkeld, 39, has been living in one of the properties since June, after spending several months in an HMO.



The former sales trainer said:

"I was absolutely desperate to get out of there, it was the wrong environment for me. My support worker fought to get me in one of these flats."


"I have been in a lot of debt in the past so I am working hard to clear that with her support and move towards getting a long-term tenancy."



Everyone has arguments, and everyone disagrees with their partners, family members and others close to them from time to time.

We all do things at times that we regret, and which cause unhappiness to those we care about. But if this begins to form a consistent pattern, then it is an indication of domestic abuse.

Increased alcohol consumption or stress over money or how to juggle everything at Christmas is not an excuse.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic Abuse is an incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive, threatening, degrading and violent behaviour, including sexual violence. In the majority of cases by a partner or ex-partner, but also by a family member or carer.

Who to contact

In an emergency always contact the police on 999.

There is a range of domestic violence and abuse services that might be able to help you, including:

- **Ask for ANI at a local pharmacy** ANI stands for Action Needed Immediately. This codeword is a discreet way to ask for emergency help from the safety of your local pharmacy.
- Options (Impact Family Services) provides confidential and non-judgemental support to women over 16, on domestic abuse issues, in a safe place and can be contacted on 07375 788 835.
- Places for People (South Tyneside Women's Aid)
 Women's Refuge offers advice and support as well as providing safe, temporary and emergency accommodation, and can be contacted on (0191) 454 8257.



Council services and payments

Residents can set up their very own Council Tax e-account online. This allows you to view your transactions, apply for Council Tax discounts, exemptions and update your information.

You can get your Council Tax bill by email (e-billing). Instead of a letter through the post, you will get an email with a link to view your Council Tax bill online.

How to register for e-billing

- 1. Register for your online Council Tax account (you will need your Council Tax account number, which you can find on your bill).
- 2. Once you've registered, you will be asked to sign up for e-billing.

If you have already set up your online Council Tax account (which is separate to the Council's e-services online account), you can sign up for e-billing by logging in to your account and selecting 'Change how I receive my Council Tax bill'.

Once you have registered for your online Council Tax account, you can also log in to check:

- your balance
- the instalments you will pay
- the next and previous payments on your account
